- I. Handwritten papers
 - a. White loose-leaf paper, college ruled
 - b. No frilly edges or dog-eared pages
 - c. Blue or black ink
 - d. Write on one side of the paper only.
 - e. Begin all pages on the top line.
 - f. Do not write on the bottom line or the space underneath it.
 - g. The ruled, vertical lines on notebook paper mark the left and right margins.
 - h. Indent each new paragraph about an inch.
 - i. Double space on formal compositions.
 - j. Pagination
 - 1. Use Arabic numerals
 - 2. No decoration!!
 - 3. Top right or bottom center
 - 4. Begin pagination on 2nd page
